

From the Board

The Board has agreed to the following changes to our rules & regulations:

- Trailers with slide-outs on both sides of the trailer will now be allowed in the Port. The overall length of the trailer still needs to be within 36 feet and the total square footage must be under 400 sq. ft. Your trailer must not impede your neighbors site. All trailers need to be approved by the Site Improvement Committee. It is recommended that you have your trailer approved before purchase or contact a Board member if you have any questions.
- Concrete pads may extend to the front of your trailer. The front edge of the concrete must line up to the front of the body of your trailer. Concrete extensions must be approved by the Site Improvement Committee and the installation/pouring of the concrete must be done by a licensed contractor.

No new trailers will be allowed into the Port from now until Site Selection Day on April 22, 2017.



Dotty's Rice Pudding

In Memory of Helen "Dotty" Palladino From her son Big Al

2 quarts + 1 cup of Milk

3 Eggs

1 cup of sugar

1 cup of rice

Cinnamon

Put rice in pot & wash with water. Drain water from rice. Put 2 qt. of milk in pot with rice & add 1/2 cup sugar. Let it come to a boil & lower the heat & simmer for 1 hour or until it thickens. Stir constantly after it thickens. Remove from heat.

In a bowl add 3 eggs. 1/2 cup sugar & 1 cup milk & beat well. Then add it to the rice. Mix all ingredients together & put into casserole dish, when cool, sprinkle with cinnamon.
